### FROM THE PRIEST IN CHARGE

*"and a little child shall lead them" Isaiah 11:6*

A wise person recently told me that parents don't just raise children, children also raise parents. As a relatively new parent I have come to believe that this is true. My life has changed so much since my son Isaiah was born; it has changed the way I sleep, the way I cook, the way I go to work, my marriage has changed, it has changed the way that I pray. Parenthood is also the most challenging thing I have ever done.

I have also grown. I have a completely new understanding of the love of God since I had a child. The love that I have and feel so intensely for my son has given me a glimpse of the love that God has for each one of us. This has led me to understand my vocation as a priest, as a husband, as a father, as a baptized Christian with a new depth and broadness. Being a parent has also given me a new perspective on what is really essential, really important in life. It has repositioned the way I think about my work and my career, and what I really want my life and my family's life to be all about.

Just as children raise parents, I also have come to believe that as a parish community we raise our children together, but our children also raise us. I don't know how many times I have heard from a family that they came to church for their children, and later found that being part of the community of faith feeds themselves as well. At Grace I hear again and again, from both parents and kids, how much the children love coming to church. For our whole community, young and old alike, children in our worship and in our community life bring us surprise, unanticipated graces, delight and deeper awareness of our membership in the broader family of God. As I see it, much of the vibrancy of Grace Church flows out of this glorious presence of children with us: our children are raising our community.

Right now our children and youth programs happen because of the heroic efforts of three people: Deb Smith, Catherine Smith and Maria Fenn. They teach and coordinate our Sunday school, Wednesday Night Godly Play and Teen Group. Many others also help out through teaching, cooking dinners, serving as classroom doorkeepers and assistants, and in a multitude of other ways. My hope is that this year we can broaden the leadership of our children and youth programs from these three involving more of the community in teaching and leading our programs. In order to do this, we need your help.

Teaching and leading children and youth programs is not just for parents, but any member of the community who feels called can join in the raising of this community. On the next page, please see an outline of the needs we have for teachers and children and youth leaders next year along with some of the schedule changes for the fall.

## **FALL 2008 CHILDREN AND YOUTH PROGRAM SCHEDULE AND NEEDS**

After meeting with parents and hearing a lot of feedback, it has been decided to make some change to our Sunday School and Godly Play schedules starting in the Fall. In addition, in order to comply with Diocesan Safe Church standards we need to have at least two adults in every classroom. If you have questions or comments, or are ready to learn more about teaching and leading our children and youth, please contact any member of the ad hoc children and youth committee (Noah Evans, Maria Fenn, John Rogers, Catherine Smith, Deb Smith and Ivy Smith)

### **Wednesday Godly Play**

Wednesday Night Godly Play dinner will be moved to 6:00-6:45, and then Godly Play class I (preschool-3<sup>rd</sup> grade) & II (4<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> grade) will meet from 6:45-7:45. There will also be occasional adult education at 6:45 on Wednesdays throughout the year.

#### **NEEDS:**

- At least two new trained Godly Play teachers. (There is a two-day training offered in September; if two people agree to go, Noah will also join them for the training.)
- Several adults to regularly serve as classroom “greeters” to assist with classes

### **Sunday School**

The Preschool – 4<sup>th</sup> grade Sunday School class will continue to meet during the 10:00 service, with the kids entering church at the Peace. The 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> grade class will be in church, and leave immediately after receiving communion for class during the last few minutes of the service and coffee hour. We decided to move this class time because of the ability for the older kids to sit through and fully participate in church and the increased involvement of these kids as acolytes and readers.

#### **NEEDS:**

- At least two, preferably four, new teachers to join in teaching Sunday school for either class.
- Classroom Assistants to help with the class and serve as the second adult in the classroom

### **Confirmation Class**

Noah will be teaching this class to youth in 8<sup>th</sup> grade and above. The class will meet mostly on Wednesday nights throughout the year.

## **A NOTE FROM THE TREASURER**

As we approach mid year, day-to-day finances at Grace Church are in good order. Income is generally keeping up with operating expenses, and we remain on a balanced budget path for 2009. As you know, much of our ability to maintain positive cash flow depends on the timely receipt of pledge income. Please continue to keep your pledge payments up to date even if summer plans take you away. Quarterly contribution statements will be sent out in July.

A reminder to everyone that my monthly Treasurer Reports are posted on the bulletin board across from the kitchen. (3 Months of reports will be posted at one time, if you need access to previous reports please call the office). These reports provide regular budget updates and highlights of short- and longer-term financial management activities. Also, I am thrilled to report that the Grace Church Finance Committee (Dennis Hale, Bill Honeycutt, Kathy Mumma, Naida Gavrelis) is firmly in place. We have already met twice. Our mission is to critically examine financial management practices, assess budgetary challenges related to operating expenses and capital needs, and make recommendations for Vestry consideration.

## A MESSAGE FROM TED

I'm sitting here in a corner of the Baltimore/Washington Airport., having just completed Morning Prayer. My prayer hasn't really ended ... not that I think it ever really does. This morning, my head is full of life's questions. As I journey home, or rather back to Boston, en route to Ft. Wayne, Indiana, I wonder about the meaning of home. What, or where, is "home?"

Home could be with my mother and the family that needs me right now, as they deal with their grief and sorrow caused by the death of my step-father. I think there's a part of all of us that will always feel as though wherever "mom," or "dad," or some other familial or pseudo-familial connection resides, is the place we call home. As we carry all of those who are intimately connected to our lives in our hearts and minds, maybe that's home.

Then, again, home might be that place we've made for ourselves. It's that place of comfort where the dog greets us at the door with joy and wet kisses, and where our cat happily jumps back into the comfort of our arms. It's that place where we cohabitate with our spouse, children, roommate, or whoever else happens to be a part of our lives. Maybe home is that place where the neighbors are familiar and where we know the name of the clerk in the local grocery store.

Engaging in mission, I have yet another understanding of home. As I sit down to dinner in the house of a local church leader, share lunch with children in an orphanage, meet with a bishop over a cup of coffee, I have this stirring in my heart that brings me great joy. I feel a fullness in my heart and soul that I don't always experience elsewhere in my life. I often say to myself, "Ah, I'm home." To use a cliché, maybe home is where the heart is. As Christians, our heart isn't always in the familiar and the comfortable. It also might not be with immediate family. As a missionary, I feel as though I'm "home" in Christ when I'm a pilgrim, putting my faith, trust, and hope in God.

Hmm ... Home ... Where's "home" for you? Is it a place? Is it a feeling? Maybe "home" is all of these things. Maybe as we carry Christ in our hearts, throughout our daily lives, home is anywhere we want it to be. Maybe "home" is just a state of mind? Maybe home is wherever we feel "at home."

Right now, as I cancel my current travel arrangements, rebook travel itineraries, reorganize my schedule, and begin writing the service for Wally's funeral, home is Ft. Wayne. ... with a heavy heart, I'm going home ...

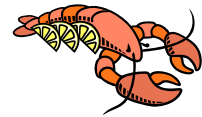
## B-SAFE SUMMER PROGRAM

The Bishop's Summer Academic and Fun Enrichment Program (B-SAFE) started at St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, Boston in the summer of 2000 as a way to provide urban children with a safe environment during the summer break when they would otherwise be on the streets unsupervised.

Since 2000 B-SAFE has spread to five sites in Boston and this summer is scheduled to open a sixth site for 60 children at St. Luke's/San Lucas Episcopal Church on Washington Avenue, in Chelsea. The Program's goal is to build a community where young people can feel safe and connected. Through small groups, low staff-to-camper ratios and team building activities, B-SAFE creates tight groups that foster friendships and trusting relationships. A key to the success of the program - and this is where our parish comes in - is support, both volunteer and financial. We are being asked to provide lunch and snack for two days during the last week of July: Tuesday, July 29th and Wednesday, July 30th. Additionally, on Friday, August 1<sup>st</sup>, we will have an active part in supporting a day trip for campers and staff.

I know summer is a busy time, especially for parents with young children. However, if you could come along with us on the day of the outing (tentatively set for Hampton Beach) or help with the lunch program one day or two days or even a few hours, it would be greatly appreciated. ## THANKSGIVING FAIRE AND LOBSTER LUNCH COMETH IN NOVEMBER

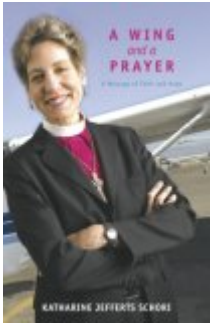

## VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

Naida Gavrelis reported that Grace Church has received a bequest for \$24,000 from the estate of Roger Sykes. She noted that she will be discussing with the Finance Committee how we will manage these funds.

Margaret Smist reported that the Rectory has been rented and that a two year lease has been signed.

Warren Ramirez updated Vestry members on the Bell Tower Project. He highlighted that the project has expanded to include other historic repairs at Grace Church. A grant has been applied for. Warren discussed the terms of the grant and noted that a presentation will take place on Sunday, June 22<sup>nd</sup> after the 10 AM service to inform the parish, as a whole, about the status of the project.

Vestry members discussed suggestions received from parishioners about the Mission Statement written at the Vestry Retreat. Using these suggestions Vestry members changed the final version to read: *Grace Episcopal Church is a multigenerational, diverse and welcoming Christian community that values shared leadership, service to those in need, and nurturing all in the love of God.*

Noah announced that we have received a gift of \$2,000 toward choir robes as well as a gift of \$500.00 for organ tuning and repair.

Noah discussed his meetings with parents last Sunday. He discussed his hope that we can broaden the leadership for Children's education, noting that he and two others are planning to take the Godly Play training course. And, he is looking for one more person to sign on.

The book chosen for the Discussion Group after the 9 AM Sunday service is the Presiding Bishop, Katharine Jefferts Schori's recently published book entitled *"A Wing and a Prayer"*. Copies are available (\$15).
