Renewing Ministry in the Mystic Valley Deanery

(the article is adapted from the Rev. Mathew Cadwell, Rector of Emmanuel Wakefield's, article on the subject written for his Parish newsletter)

Over the past few years, the clergy and parishes of the Mystic Valley Deanery have been exploring ways to work together to bring new vibrancy to our parishes and enhance Christian witness in our area. The Mystic Valley Deanery is unique in the Diocese of Massachusetts in having the greatest number of part-time and bi-vocational, or non-full time, clergy (8 of 13 parishes). While this reality reflects the financial circumstances in our churches, it is not a reflection on the dedication to discipleship or the vibrancy of the ministry happening in the Deanery. But it does suggest that our parishes would benefit by exploring in depth how we might continue to work together—to make the resources we have go further and to deepen opportunities for engagement and Christian community here. We have begun that important work, but we know that more can be done.

The Diocese is aware of the longing for deeper relationship and ministry together among the clergy and people of our parishes. Toward that end, for the next year Bishop Gayle Harris will be working intensively with the clergy and parishes of the Mystic Valley Deanery to explore possibilities. A full half of her ministry time will be spent with us. Bishop Harris will be getting to know us better in a more intimate way than is usually possible for bishops and parishes and then she will be helping us explore opportunities for collaboration, revitalization and renewal, both within our individual parishes and across the deanery. This is an open process in that there is no concrete goal in mind, other than uncovering our hidden potential and setting in place strategies to develop this potential further.

During the summer months Bishop Harris will be visiting the deanery parishes in a less formal way than she would on an official visitation. Her goal will be to learn more about our ministry—the things we do well, areas of challenge for us, and our hopes and aspirations. She is scheduled to be present for worship at Grace Church on Sunday, August 29 at our 9:00 a.m. service. Please plan to join us for worship and fellowship that day as we welcome our bishop among us and begin an exciting year of exploring and visioning together.

Grace Church's New Ministry with Tufts University and Changes in Rachael's Responsibilities

Grace Church is about to embark on a new ministry with Tufts University. Our intern, Rachael Pettengill, will begin to meet with Tufts students in August to help form a student group. As of August first her title will be "Lay Associate for Student Ministry."

Rachael will be using a model of community organization and relational evangelism similar taught to both her Diomass Intern program and our Leadership Development Initiative GreenUp CleanUp group. This model involves identifying, recruiting, and developing leadership, organizing community around that leadership, and building power from the resources of that community. This is achieved through the five practices: Public Narrative (equipping people to turn their values into sources of motivation as a story of self, story of us, and story of now), Relationship Building (building the relationships through which people can commit to work together to achieve common purposes), Structuring (developing leadership by creating interdependent teams designed to collaborate across multiple levels of coordination), Strategizing (devising tactics to creatively translate resources into the power to achieve clear goals at each level of organization), and Acting (producing specific, observable, and measurable results to evaluate progress, exercise accountability, and adapt strategy based on experience). Using this model, Rachael will help to form a leadership team of students to begin worship and outreach ministries with Tufts students and our local community.

Margaret Smist will be serving as Rachael's coach, meeting with her weekly for reflection and supervision. Margaret will also be working with and learning from the team of coaches who are supervising other Relational Evangelist interns with the Diomass Intern Program. Noah Evans will continue to work with Rachael, supervising her at weekly Staff meetings, collaborating on a possible student worship service, serving as a pastoral resource for Tufts students and helping to integrate the Tufts ministry with the life of Grace Church. This is an exciting new model of ministry for our parish, Diocese and the Episcopal Church.

In order to open the time needed to develop the Tufts ministry Rachael's role and responsibilities in parish life will also change. She will be rotating off of the Education Committee, and she will remain on the Outreach committee. Rachael will no longer have a formal role in our education ministries or on Wednesday nights. Her administrative responsibilities over the weekly email and some electronic communication are being transferred to Carol over the summer. Her work training LEMs and Lectors will also conclude this summer.

As a member of this parish in the Discernment for Ordination process, Rachael will still be present on Sundays, preaching occasionally and serving as a LEM.

OUTREACH AT GRACE

Answering the call.

Three years ago, St. Luke's parish answered God's call and turned a meager food pantry, consisting of a filing cabinet full of outdated canned goods, into a full-blown ministry that serves over 200 families every month. For some time now, the Outreach Committee has sensed the stirrings of a call to do something similar at Grace. A number of factors started to converge: a \$10,000 bequest earmarked for outreach; a Micah intern willing to lead us through a Lenten journey on the hunger issue; and our work at St. Luke's, where we always provide an abundance of volunteers when it's our week to cook at the soup kitchen. There have been many expressions of the value we as a parish place on taking our faith out into our hurting world. The Outreach Committee has been searching for a way to match the interests and talents of our congregation with the deepest needs of our community.

We think we might have found it. We are exploring the possibility of working in partnership with English @ Large and the Medford Family Network (MFN) to provide an English as a Second Language (ESL) program at Grace Church.

Why ESL?

This potential ministry was identified mainly through conversations with Marie Cassidy at MFN, and it resonated with what Maria Fenn and other Clothing Pantry volunteers have witnessed. The ability to speak English is vital for immigrant parents. It helps them gain meaningful employment, pursue further education if they wish to, and take part in social activities. Also, a major problem is that the balance of power in the household shifts to the children when parents must rely on them for all communications with the outside world. MFN currently runs an ESL course in the afternoons, but many working parents are not able to attend. That's where we hope to fill a need, by providing evening ESL classes.

Learning English is the key to these parents' ability to lead a full life in their new community of Medford. We believe Grace Church has the will and resources to help change our neighbors' lives in this way. As we look into the logistics of doing this, we will continue to discern whether this is truly God's call for us.

What do you think about this potential ministry? Are you as excited as we are? Do you have any expertise that would help us plan and execute this new program? Would you be interested in volunteering? Join us in the conversation. The GBFB depends on volunteers to inspect, sort, and repack "salvaged" food and grocery products, which they receive. The items are then redistributed to nearly 600 hunger-relief agencies throughout eastern MA. If you would like to volunteer, you must be at least 16. Grace Church is sending volunteers on August 14, Sept 18, Oct 16, Nov 20, and Dec 4. Episcopal City Mission – Annual Meeting

The 166th annual meeting of the Episcopal City Mission of our diocese took place on Tuesday, June 6 at BU's Sherman Union. Rev. Noah, a board member, Rachel Pettengill, Micah Project intern, and I, Susan Maltz, delegate to ECM attended. The meeting opens with a reception and displays of information by various organizations supported by ECM. ECM supports various aspects of urban ministry including: advocacy and outreach involving housing and homeless individuals and families and also recent immigrants as well as CORI reform, which has recently passed the Massachusetts legislature. The latter mitigates problems non-violent offenders may have in breaking into the job market.

During the dinner, the business meeting is held, awards are given, and there is usually an address by a person whose efforts embody the vision of ECM. The Tobin award was given to the Rev. Deborah W. Little Wyman, founder of Ecclesia Ministries and the Common Cathedral, a ministry to homeless people. Mr. Alan Khazei, recent candidate in the primary for Senator and founder of City Year, gave a short speech calling us to community service. He stated that the idea of small vs. big government is out of date. His model is one of Big Citizenship where the question is: Are we better off instead of am I better off? He mentioned various people whose call to service made a huge difference such as Jane Addams, Mahatma Ghandi, and Desmond Tutu.

Finally, the meeting presents an opportunity to meet and mingle with other members of our diocese, as well as to come to a deeper understanding of the diocese.
